Dear Parents/Carers

It is easy to forget the real people behind the news. This was the theme of assemblies this week for Year 7-10. Last Friday my brother (a UN Ambassador to Bangladesh) had a close shave. The café where he goes to breakfast every day in the diplomatic quarter of Bangladesh's capital city Dakar, was attacked by terrorists. Luckily for him, he wasn't there at the time. However, many others (Italians, Japanese and Bangladeshis amongst them) were less lucky and there were 20 fatalities. Elsewhere, we have been concerned nationally by the rise of reported racist and discriminatory incidents in the wake of the EU Referendum vote. We are a tolerant and diverse community and it is so important that we all stand together to promote a courteous, respectful and civilised society.
