Dear Parents/Carers

As Headteacher, one gets used to dealing with the unexpected. However, last night finished unusually! Yesterday's Sixth Form Open Evening was a big success. We had a huge turnout with an estimated 2,000 people on site in total. Sixth Formers did a wonderful job of guiding students round school and our speakers in Big School, **Sarah Quinn** and **Connor Walton**, as well as our many student presenters around the site were very impressive. I was just about to ring the closing bell for the evening when our fire bell went off. The cause was a rather embarrassed potential New Veseyan, who, while talking to one of our teachers, leant back against a wall and inadvertently set our fire alarm off. Contrary to rumour, we don't think he was a 'plant' from a competitor school Sixth Form! The site was cleared in an efficient manner. A big thank you to all staff and students, who facilitated this, especially **Ben Jesson**, our House Captain, who showed great leadership skills at the front of school. A big thank you also to all who contributed in front and behind the scenes to the success of the evening especially **Dave Goodwin** and the 6th Form team, **Julie Evetts, Kallyann Williams, Linda Pryor** and all the administration team involved, as well as the site team of **Jon Holden, Paul Boyle, Andy Tomlinson** and **Kevin Wamsley**.

Year 11 continued with their preparations for the mock examinations this week. There was a Revision evening on Tuesday evening. A big thank you to **Ralph Brocklebank**, Head of Year 11, and **Heather Hodkinson**, Learning Mentor, for organising a focused session for parents and students.

There have been some excellent academic enrichment activities this week on the theme of STEM. We have a good number of students from Years 7-8, for the weekly BP challenge which is being led by **Lewis Graham** (Biology Department) and **Craig Guy** (Chemistry Department). Meanwhile, the weekly Scalextric Challenge for Year 7 with **Adam Belcher** (Design Technology Department) has begun. How fast will they be able to race their cars? 
We have sent a letter to everyone this week regarding our forthcoming Senior drama production of 'Two', which has been supported by Centrestage. 'Two' is a powerful and exciting play by Jim Cartwright. It has great humour and drama. The play will be performed at 7.30 pm on Thursday 10th and Friday 11th December. Tickets are priced £9 for adults and £5 for students/concessions. Please note that because of some of the language used in the play, we recommend that the play is suitable for Year 9 and upwards (and by parental approval only for Year 8 boys).

Finally, we have begun consulting this week on a new admissions policy for September 2017. This is particularly pertinent to Year 7 entry. As a School and Governing Body, we believe that an essential part of our moral purpose is that our school should be socially inclusive and representative. It has been a cause of concern to us that grammar schools are perceived by some (including former grammar school boy, Sir Michael Wilshaw, the Head of OFSTED) to be places of middle-class privilege, hard to access, unless students are coached for the entrance examination. Nationally, there have been a number of initiatives taken by grammar schools across the country to widen access to grammar schools. In our own city of Birmingham, the King Edward's grammar schools

have introduced an admissions policy that seeks to widen access. Here at BVGS, we are consulting on the idea of introducing the same policy. This means that we propose to establish a qualifying score. We propose that first priority for the 160 BVGS school places available in Year 7 would go to those who are Looked After Children and Previously Looked After Children and then the next priority group would be those students who will attract funding for the Pupil Premium. We would seek to fill up to a maximum of 32 places for students, meeting our qualifying score, who attract the Pupil Premium. The remaining 128 places would then be allocated to those who have met the qualifying score by rank order. For those who would like to know more, a copy of this proposed policy will be going on our website.




