Dear Parents/Carers

First of all, there has been so much to catch up on about the Easter holiday period. Thank you also to **Linda Pryor** for her role in organising this excellent opportunity. What a lovely trip it was. Reading the tweets, I was quite jealous of their visits to the architectural gems of Gaudi's Parc Guel and La Sagrada Familia as well as the spiritual centre of football, El Camp Nou, and, of course, the churros! Easter was, for our senior students from Years 11-13, a period of concentrated revision. In Year 11 assembly on Monday, we reflected on how effective we have been so far and considered what underpins motivations using the paradigm of Maslow's hierarchy of needs. The research is clear on what effective revision looks like. Active revision is crucial. Students need to condense their notes for each subject and topic and they need to keep testing themselves, especially with past paper questions. Continued rigour and enthusiasm in this undertaking will re-pay great dividends for students in the summer. We wish them ongoing fortitude and determination for the weeks ahead. We encourage all students to get help from their subject teachers wherever it is needed. There continue to be a number of GCSE revision opportunities here in school. See the attached document.

This is now the time for the rest of the student body from Years 7-10 to write their revision plans and get started on operation revision. The school examinations, the week commencing the 6 June, are just round the corner and they need to be prepared. The students also need to bear in mind that in some subjects setting/banding decisions are made, in part, on the basis of their summer exam performance. Thank you to parents for all the support you give to helping students get into good home study revision patterns.

For your information, forms are available for parents to apply for assistance with school uniform from Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust. To be eligible parents must be permanently resident in one of the four wards of Sutton Coldfield and forms must be returned to school by 22 April 2016.
