Dear Parents/Carers

This has been a very busy week indeed. Last weekend, the Junior Hockey Tour to the south west concluded. The boys had some excellent fixtures against Dauntsey's School and Millfield. They acquitted themselves well and were a pleasure to work with. A big thank you to **Chris Howell**, **Alex Davis** and **Dave Devey** who led the trip. As the students battled on the hockey pitch, Year 7 and 8 boys were pitted against King Edward's High School for Girls in the field of chess. It was a tight game and KES squeaked home 6.5 to 5.5. At the same time, we welcomed our German exchange partners from Bayreuth. A big thank you to **Herr Götschel** for organising, and of course our brilliant host families. Over the week, amongst other things, our guests visited different places of worship in Birmingham, had an audience with the Lord Mayor of Birmingham and spent some time at the Black Country Museum.

The school has now been awarded a Recognition of Commitment Award from Unicef as part of its work towards becoming a Rights Respecting School whereby the rights of children are central to the ethos, culture and work of the school. During the last two weeks **Ruth Hearn** (Deputy Head Teacher) and **Kate Steadman** (Assistant Head Teacher) have been talking to students in assemblies about the Convention of the Rights of the Child and the Rights Respecting Award.

Also in assemblies, we have welcomed **Dan Hicks** (OV) MCIa, FSA, Associate Professor in Archaeology, University of Oxford and Curator of the Pitt Rivers Museum. Dan spoke eloquently about the importance of students reading beyond the syllabus, showing intellectual curiosity and following their academic interests. It was a very similar message to what was given at the Oxbridge conference attended by Sixth Formers on Monday. University entrance is more competitive than ever. Our students need to be aware of the high standard at which they need to perform to be successful.

Year 11 received their interim report cards today. Things are generally moving in the right direction. However this is now the time for the boys to really step up. Every student needs a revision plan in place so that they use Easter profitably. Most Year 11 students will be going on study leave after the leaving assembly on Friday 6 May. However for some there will be a need for a supported structured programme of work here in school for the week beginning 9 May. Thank you in anticipation of your understanding with this.

On Monday 37 A-Level Chemists, along with **Jay Lal** and **Dr Silvia Carroll** attended Science Live at the Birmingham Town Hall. Scientists appearing on the day included Professor Andrea Sella (On rare earth elements), Dr Philip Ball (On Biochemistry), Dr Peter Wothers (On Spectroscopy) and Dr Sujata Kundu (On changing her mind about carbon). It was an excellent day.

In Mathematics this week we held the Intermediate Maths Challenge. Meanwhile **Patrick Singleton** from the Upper Sixth gave a lecture to interested Year 7 and 8 students on 'Modular Numbers'.

This week has also seen our first STEM Outreach afternoon with **Mr Belcher** and **Mr Semple** laying on Coding and Robot Football for Year 4 and 5 students from Cromwell, New Oscott and Kingsthorpe Primary Schools. A big thank you also to our student helpers **Sam Gill**, **Gabriel Plume** and **Rory Barber**.

It was lovely to see Year 8 students and parents for Parents' Evening on Wednesday. There was a lot of positive feedback and areas for improvement given. An excellent evening.

This has been another great week for Music. I have heard lots of good things about the Woodwind Chamber Concert on Tuesday night at St Michael's, Boldmere. Meanwhile yesterday's Spring Concert was absolutely stunning. I will be writing to all students and staff involved. However I have to say that the quality of the performance was excellent and it was particularly lovely to see students performing for the first time, or



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trying new things publicly. The Head of the Birmingham Music Service, Ciaran O'Donnell, was present and he was blown away by the variety and quality of what he heard. A big thank you to all the Birmingham Peripatetic Music Team, especially **Lisa Riley**, who has served our school for many years, and for whom yesterday was the last concert as a Vesey parent, and of course our Director of Music **Maryann Dye**.

This week we have marked Sport Relief. The total figure has yet to be calculated, but there have been lots of exciting things going on. There have been Chess Challenges in the Library v Teachers, Table Tennis Marathons and of course today's non-uniform day. Thanks in particular to **Sarah Quinn**, Charity Captain and her team. 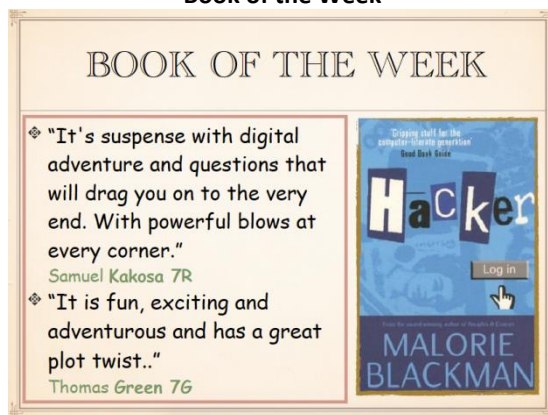

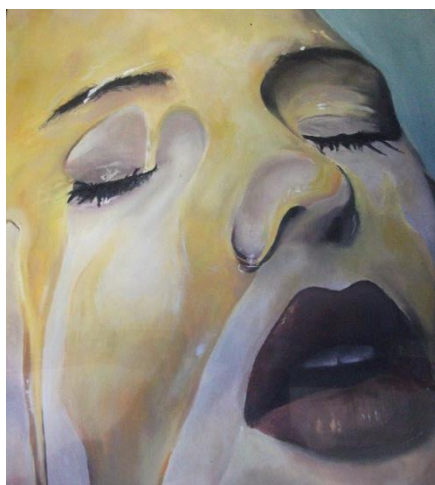
