This week has been overshadowed by the terrible events in Paris last Friday. A minute's silence was held across the school on Monday at 11am and also at the start of all French lessons on Monday. Assemblies have been held throughout the week. Above all, we have sought to stress the resilience and humanity of the responses of ordinary Parisians, as embodied by the "don du sang" for the hospitals and the "porte ouverte" for those needing shelter, and lauded the quietly defiant words of the inspirational **Antoine Leiris**: "You will not have my hatred."

Elsewhere in assemblies this week, **James Cutting** and **Tom Hooper**, Year 11 senior prefects, delivered a superb assembly to Years 9-10 on World AIDS day, which is happening on Tuesday December 1st. Meanwhile, I have been speaking to Years 7-11 students regarding the Student Voice Fund. The PAC have allocated £3,000 to this fund. We are encouraging students to think carefully about the needs of our school community and, in particular, to consider a small scale project that could make a big difference to the quality of Vesey life. 
