This week has seen publication of the DoE Performance Tables (See [here](#)). I am pleased to see that at KS5 we have an average point score for A Level entry of 248.8 ie B+, the third highest state school in Birmingham and Walsall (behind Camp Hill Boys and Camp Hill Girls). Furthermore, at GCSE BVGS is ranked fourth in Birmingham. Our point score per student is lower than some schools because we believe that offering ten GCSEs and doing them well, is better than offering a bigger range of subjects. Also worthy of note, particularly as we consider offering up to 20% of our new Year 7 places for September 2017 to students from disadvantaged backgrounds, who meet our qualifying score, is the excellent performance of students from all backgrounds. 



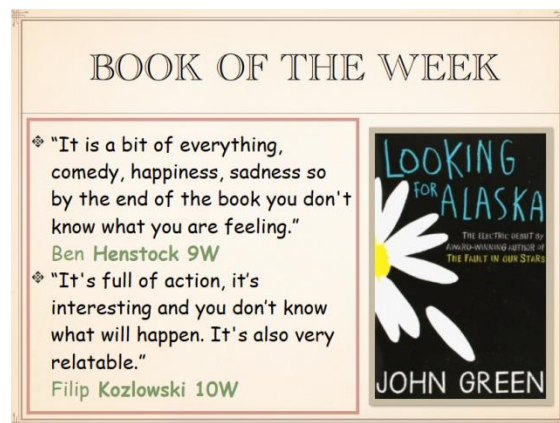
