Dear Parents/Carers

Friday 11th November is always a significant day in our school calendar. Today, we held three services at the same time at three points in the School: the Sports Hall (Years 7-10), Big School, which is home to our World War 2 memorial (Years 11-Upper Sixth) and Old Big School, which is home to our World War 1 memorial (a number of Upper Sixth students). **Mr Bowen** (Deputy Headteacher), **Mr Goodwin** (Assistant Headteacher) and I focussed particularly on the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Somme. (As you may be aware, the School recently visited the Somme and the students and staff involved found this a most poignant experience). We talked about men like 26 year old. **Captain Walter Sampson OV**, who was mentioned in dispatches on June 30th 1916. Sampson attended BVGS between 1899 and 1907. He was a keen athlete and footballer and was awarded the Victores Ludorum in 1902. He was also one of the founder members of the Vesey Old Boys' Club started just before the war. Killed in action in 1916, he is buried in Pozieres British Cemetery, Ovillers-La Boisselle and is commemorated on the Sutton Coldfield Memorial, King Edwards Square, and at St Peter's Church, Maney. On Sunday, I will be accompanied by our three senior students: **Reiss Chahal**, **Angalea Varma** and **Brett Waldron** to the annual Remembrance Sunday Service at Holy Trinity Parish Church. **Reiss**, as School Captain, will be laying a wreath at the Sutton Coldfield Memorial on behalf of the whole Vesey community. **We will remember them.**

It was a pleasure to welcome our new parents last night's to the Parent Association Curry Evening at the Karma Lounge, Boldmere. A big thank you to **Caroline Moore** for organising this. We hope you all had a great evening.

Last night saw us hold our annual Sixth Form Open Evening. As usual, School was very full indeed. All our visitors were welcomed warmly. A huge thank you to all our amazing student guides and helpers and staff, who did such a brilliant job. We received so much excellent feedback about them. A big well done also to our presenters in Big School: **Mr Goodwin**, **Matt Price** (Lower Sixth) and **Sophie Lloyd** for their assured and thoughtful speeches.

The key take-home message of the evening, I hope, was the importance of working really hard for your GCSEs. Our school, like so many others, will no longer be offering AS examinations from September 2017. Instead, students will take three two year linear A levels. Those students attaining the equivalent of 66 Vesey points at GCSE have the entitlement, if they wish, of taking four A levels. With the disappearance of AS, success at GCSE has therefore much greater significance, a big impact on the university options available to every student. This fact is one that I'm sure is not lost on Year 11, who are currently preparing for next week's 'mock' examinations. Please note additionally, that we have conducted our annual review of the curriculum. Consequently, from September 2017, we will sadly not be offering 'A' level Geology to Lower Sixth students. (Those students currently studying AS Geology will, of course, be able to continue with their A2 study of Geology in September 2017.)

Elsewhere, this week the Sixth Form have undertaken the UKMT Senior Maths Challenge. Meanwhile, the English department led by Mrs Haywood ran an excellent second (back by popular demand) English Support Evening for KS4 parents. Also, a group of our linguists enjoyed, accompanied by **Herr Gotschel**, an exciting range of language taster sessions at the University of Birmingham.

Many thanks to all parents who are supporting our BVGS Inspiration and Excellence Fund. As I look forward there are big financial challenges ahead for our school, namely central government funding cuts and increased costs. Together these cuts and increased costs pose a very real risk to maintaining the momentum


Well done to the top merit winners this week: They will be invited for hot chocolate and cookies with me next week.


