Swimming Gala at Wyndley

There were three new school records set on Wednesday at the Swimming Gala:
Charlotte Fellows (x2) in the Girls Butterfly (13.94secs, beating R Wilson's record from 2017) and also in the Front Crawl (13.58secs beating B Wright's record from 2014). 8W also set a new record in the Freestyle Relay (1.00.15min, beating Gold House's record from 2009). The event ran very smoothly, and there was an excellent atmosphere amongst the students. There were some excellent performances. It was particularly pleasing to see Purple House compete in the Canon Relay (an event normally made up of one pupil in each age category) but with no Senior students their squad was made up of two Yr7's, three Yr8's and two Yr9's. 

School ends at 11:45am tomorrow. We wish everyone a safe journey home. Please can parents not park on Boswell Road and be respectful our neighbours in the vicinity.



