Reading and The Accelerated Reader Programme

Here at Bishop Vesey's Grammar School, we love reading: we love to let our minds run free in the fictional world created by an author; or befriend and learn from a character that we have met in the book we are reading; or even just to find a moment alone with a book to find some relaxation after some exciting, but challenging lessons. We also love celebration and being able to push our reading to new levels. In Key Stage 3 at BVGS we use the Accelerated Reader programme to see how well we are reading, to see what our current reading age is and what we need to read to improve our ability, but also to get certificates, win prizes and to boost the merits for our form and house in the reading competitions. The Accelerated Reader programme records how many books we have read through doing some fun quizzes to see how much we have comprehended too. These scores add up to the AR Competition prizes – it could be an Amazon voucher (to buy a book that you had always wanted, or a fountain pen to show off with in class), or it could be a form time with some goodies thrown in for whole class. You are already at an advantage: if you manage four of Mrs Haywood's recommended reading list challenge, you will have four books to do a quiz on when you get to school!

Reading is part of what we do here at BVGS. Reading is part of our school values: it leads us to our natural spirit of enquiry and curiosity: it is, quite simply, part of who we are. We look forward to seeing you (and reading with you) at our school soon.
