Programme has been created to widen
access to Bishop Vesey's Grammar School for

## **OUR VISION**

Founded in 1527, Bishop Vesey's Grammar School is one of the UK's leading state grammar schools, with a long-standing reputation for high academic standards and an outstanding co-curricular programme. We are a selective school for boys with a co-educational Sixth Form.

Located in Sutton Coldfield in the West Midlands, we have over **1,350 pupils** from Year 7 through to Sixth Form. Academic performance is consistently amongst the best schools nationally. The Sunday Times annual Parent Power League Table, based on 'A' level and GCSE results, has placed Bishop Vesey's

Grammar School as a **top 50 state school** every year since 2013. Progress 8 data shows students make excellent progress irrespective of their background. Our students go to the best universities nationally and internationally. Since 2017, over **70%** go on to **elite Russell Group universities** with, on average, 11 receiving offers from **Oxford** and **Cambridge** universities.

As we look to our 500th anniversary, we are ambitious to renew our mission of inspiration and excellence: to become a top 20 state school, a centre for scholarship and community, outward-looking and innovative.

## **REALISING OUR VISION**

#### Our School now faces urgent challenges:

- Insufficient existing Sixth Form study capacity means students are studying in spaces that are inadequate and unsuitable for collaborative working.
- The result of our successful Lower School expansion in recent years means
  that from 2024 there will be fewer spaces available for external students to
  join in year 12. Unless addressed, this will restrict our offer providing fewer
  places for external disadvantaged students and negatively impact the
  post-16 gender balance, so important to the vibrant Vesey experience.
- New classrooms are needed for growing subjects currently housed in temporary classrooms.
- Our library is inadequate and doesn't meet the needs of our students.
- Our internal dining space restricts mixing between all ages of the school community at recreational times.
- Much of the school estate is tired and in need of refurbishment.

We now have ambitious plans to address these challenges and to bring our physical facilities up to the same levels of excellence as the education we provide.

Central to this is a new Learning Resource Centre located at the front of the School. The new 1,300 m² facility, set over three floors will be home to a dedicated Sixth Form Centre, additional subject-specific classrooms, library, flexible social space and improved dining facilities. It is designed to enrich the student experience and promote new ways of working such as collaboration and 'incubation spaces' for student entrepreneurship, helping students develop the skills demanded in the 21st century, better preparing them for university and the workplace.

The Centre will enable us to expand our Sixth Form, opening more opportunities for students beyond BVGS, ensuring that we sustain the gender balance, and importantly, serve more disadvantaged students from across the region, building our 'social capital'. It will also attract more funding for the School.


Flexible social space will be available to our community out of school hours, which as well as generating income for the School, will improve well-being, foster talent and support businesses so that people, as John Vesey wrote 500 years ago in the 1527 Foundation Charter, 'might more happily live'.


Our new building will be informed by 'green' principles and will provide BVGS students with 'hands-on' learning opportunities about sustainable architecture and building processes.

We aim to have the Centre open in 2024, allowing us to undertake other much-needed refurbishments to the older parts of the School in preparation for our 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Year in 2027.

The Lower Ground Floor will be a flexible space adaptable to both study and social activities, which can also be used for workshops, presentations, drama and community use.

This floor will be eventually linked to the Grade II listed School House, which when completed, will become a new entrance for students to the School.






The Upper Ground Floor provides a **flexible Sixth Form study space**, which can be configured to suit private study, collaborative working and innovation, helping our students to hone the skills they will need for higher education and working life.

A **new dining room**, leading out on to external green spaces and connected to the existing dining facilities will enable year groups to mingle during break times.

Eventually, this floor will also be linked to the old School House.

Three subject-specific classrooms on the first floor will enable more capacity to study increasingly popular subjects.

A **new library** for the whole school will provide valuable research and study space for all year groups.



## INVESTING IN EXCELLENCE

The new Centre and refurbishment of tired spaces across the school is expected to cost over £6 million.

The Foundation Charity of Bishop Vesey's Grammar School is contributing £2.7 million and a grant of £2 million from the Department for Education has been received.

We aim to raise the remaining £1.5 million through our Investing in Excellence campaign, which will engage with trusts and foundations, businesses, parents and alumni.

The campaign offers tax effective giving opportunities for supporters, including Income, Corporation, Capital Gains and even Inheritance Tax Relief, and a high level of engagement with and accountability to all our supporters.

It also provides meaningful and appropriate recognition for supporters at all levels, ranging from a certificate of appreciation, to a plaque in the new Learning Resource Centre, to named areas and classrooms. As a guide, here are the levels of support we are seeking.

Supporters are also invited to consider a legacy to the Foundation in their Wills. Legacies will be added to our endowment fund, which will make us less reliant on major fundraising programmes in the future.
