#### Mental health platforms used

MindSafe - child-led emotional well-being tool to help students identify their current emotions. Personalised mood diary to help students become more aware of their emotional well-being - Monday registration time.

One lesson every 2 weeks.

Assessment: At the beginning of each topic students are to mind-map their current knowledge on that topic e.g. Alcohol and Drugs. At the end of each topic students are to sit a formal assessment. Each assessment should last for 30 minutes. Class teacher will need to mark the assessments and go through model answers.

#### Sequencing:

#### Racism & Discrimination

The year 8 curriculum builds on knowledge taught in year 7. Year 7 SOW began with Commando Joe's, developing team building skills. This knowledge is discussed when examining racism and discrimination and how such behaviours will lead to poor collaboration within the workplace and other settings. STRCTR competition links back to year 7's work on islamophobia and humanitarian crises. Students apply knowledge of discrimination to other protected characteristics e.g. sexuality and gender, gaining an understanding that any form of discrimination is unlawful and wrong.

#### E-Literacy

Online safety is an ongoing conversation in year 8 discussing the highs and lows of being active online. Links are made to previous knowledge on 'cyberbullying' and how this is a negative consequence. Students gain additional information on plagiarism and what this means in relation to academic studies. This is building on prior knowledge taught on copyright.

#### Knife Crime and Drug Education

Knife crime and drug education is discussed further examining not only the implications to the individual/victim but other members of the community. The learning engages more wider conversations looking at the 'ripple effect'

### Relationships

Relationships and diversity within families is discussed further. Examining the LGBTQ+ community building on knowledge learnt about same sex families and the importance about being tolerant of others.
